





Firearms and Playdate Questionnaire Playdate Safety Checklist for Parents

How to Start the Conversation

Here are a few conversation starters if you're unsure how to bring up firearm safety:

- "We're asking everyone not judging—do you keep any firearms in your home,
 and if so, how are they stored?"
- "We're careful about safety stuff like pools, medications and guns. Do you mind
 if I ask a couple of quick questions before the playdate?"
- "No judgment at all—we just want to make sure the kids are safe no matter where they are."

Before scheduling a playdate, consider asking the following:
